CAFETERIA OPEN 3 DAYS A WEEK

We are fortunate at Levack to be one of only two elementary schools in the Rainbow board to offer cafeteria services. Chartwells Food runs the cafeteria and this year they have altered their schedule and procedures for placing food orders. In the past, students have had the opportunity to order food every day of the week. This year, the food services portion will be open Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. There will still be vending machines offering milk, dairy products and other refrigerated snacks five days a week however hot food from the kiosk will only be available three days a week.

The other big change is the method of ordering. Instead of sending money with your child Chartwells has tried to make it convenient by offering an online service. Simply visit their website to place your order:

Visit the above website, select "Levack" from the list of schools and pay by credit card. They are still offering pizza all three days as well as special menu items such as tacos on Tuesdays. You can order a meal as late as 7:45 am but you can also pre-order, days or weeks in advance. Chartwell hopes parents will find this new ordering system straight-forward.

Just a reminder, there will be no cafeteria service on any day that busses are cancelled (i.e. snow/ice days). The cafeteria will open next week of school.

SCHOOL COUNCIL

We invite parents to participate in our school council. We meet four times a year usually between 4:30-6:00. Our first meeting is Thursday, September 15 at 6:00 pm in our library following our Open House. Elections will be held at that time. Other items on the agenda include the review of Fund Raising, School activities, Breakfast Program as well as programming updates. We hope you can join us.

VISITOR IDENTIFICATION TAGS

For safety reasons, all visitors to our school are required to report to the office. Visitors are also required to wear identification tags while in the school. These identification tags as well as a sign in logbook are located in the office. Parents dropping off or picking up their children are also to report to the office and are asked to wait for their children in the main entrance for security reasons and to prevent congestion in the halls.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES

We believe that each student should have the opportunity to benefit equally from our system and that students have equal access to programs and resources in the regular school day. We realize some parents may choose to send their child with some supplies however we want you to know that this is not a requirement. We budget for items such as school agendas, pencils, binders, paper, etc. We do ask that students have indoor/outdoor shoes, a backpack and a lunch bag large enough to accommodate two nutrition periods.
